### "RICHTFEST" OF THE NEW BUILDING IN OFFENBURG

Only one week after it was announced that Mr. Peter Osypka is sponsoring 2 million euros for a new institute for medical technology at Offenburg University, the University was celebrating the roofing ceremony of the new "E" -building at the Offenburg campus.

The "passive energy building" uses the algorithms and research findings obtained by Offenburg University's "Institut für Energiesystemtechnik (INES)" and will offer plenty of seminar rooms and offices.

In only one year, the Departments of Mechanical Engineering and Electrical Engineering and Information Technology will move into this new 2500 square-meter building.

# DAAD PRESIDENT AND ECM GRADUATE HOLD THE SPEECHES AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY

In October, 423 Offenburg-University students celebrated their graduation at a fully packed Oberrheinhalle on October 18. The keynote speaker at this year's graduation ceremony was Prof. Dr. Margret Wintermantel, President of the DAAD, or German Academic Exchange Service.

Carolin Lutz, a 25-year-old ECM-graduate presented a speech on behalf of the graduates this evening and also addressed her fellow students who came to Offenburg University from abroad: "It has been so exciting to learn from you - to experience Indian equanimity and optimism, Iranian cordiality and South American friendliness, to name just a few.... I very much hope that you have come to see Germany as a 'second home'."

Prof. Dr. Schüssele, director of the International Center of Offenburg University, pointed out, that with 570 international students from 76 different countries, our campus enjoys a great international atmosphere. With more than 12% international students, the university has proven to be an attractive place for students from all over the world.

Margret Wintermantel in her speech stressed the competitive edge Offenburg University has gained by going international and Rector Lieber, referring to

the places of origin of the 423 graduates, said: "They perfectly reflect both the local impact and the pronounced internationality of Offenburg University."

## HIGH SCORES FOR MPE IN THE CHE RANKING

The Centrum für Hochschulentwicklung (Center for Higher-Education Development), or CHE, has announced its latest university ranking. Offenburg University achieved top positions in the fields of Electrical Engineering and Information Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Mechatronics. In all three fields, students are very satisfied with the overall study situation, IT infrastructure, library equipment, and e-learning opportunities.

The CHE also assessed the international orientation of the different study programs. Two Offenburg University programs were ranked at the top in this regard: The tri-national Bachelor's program of Electrical Engineering and Information Engineering, "3nat," and our Master's program Process Engineering.

The CHE ranking is the most comprehensive and detailed ranking of higher-education institutions in Germany and other European countries. More than 300 universities in Germany, Austria, Switzerland and the Netherlands have been surveyed by the CHE.

# RESEARCH ACTIVITIES IN THE AREA OF ENERGY CONVERSION AND MANAGEMENT (ECM)

Manifold research activities are going on in the energy field. Professor Treffinger and his team are engaged in a collaboration with the University of Freiburg and the Fraunhofer Institute for Solar Energy Systems (ISE). One of the researchers involved is Satya Gopisetty, an ECM alumnus, who is working on small-scale decentralized energy systems.

Another research team is working on the optimization of energy-intensive processes in the steel-making industry. This project called "OpenProcess" is funded by the Federal Ministry of Education.

Recently, Professor Treffinger also organized a conference on "Integration of Wind Energy into the Energy System" in the context of a wind-energy trade fair in Offenburg. Several new research ideas and possibilities for further collaborations with industry and research institutes came out of the discussions at the conference.

# GERMAN-PAKISTANI RESEARCH COLLABORATION IN SENSOR AND COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS

Offenburg University in collaboration with the School of Science and Engineering at the renowned Lahore University of Management Sciences (LUMS) has established a German-Pakistani research project.

Initiated this year, the project aims at the development of a reliable, cost- and energy-efficient sensor and communication system for monitoring the world's largest irrigation system, which is found in Pakistan.

The project is supported by the DAAD for an initial two years and involves scientists from Lahore, Pakistan's second-largest city and capital of the Punjab Province, and Offenburg University, including some CME-students.

Offenburg Professors Schneider, Program Director of the MPE-program and Sikora, Program Director of the CME-program, visited LUMS in March and attended the "International Workshop on Intelligent Water Grids (IWG)".

### NEWS FROM THE INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS CONSULTING MBA PROGRAM (IBC):

We just received notice that IBC has been ranked by QS (Quacquarelli Symonds, one of the three most influential university rankings in the world, which also runs a number of well-known MBA-related events), in the category of "Emerging Regional" programs.

Next year (WS 2014/15) will see some changes in the IBC curriculum: A Microeconomics module will replace "Network Technology and E-Business." In return, the Logistics module will include an additional course on simulation.

Other additional offers, such as presentation skills training by members of the Galli Business Theater (Vienna/Munich) and student coaching, will further strengthen the profile of our program. Also starting in WS 2014/15, the IBC program's tuition will be increased to  $\in$  10,400.

### STUDENT SURVEY REVEALS CONSISTENTLY HIGH RATINGS FOR GRADUATE SCHOOL

In the 2013 survey of first-semester students at Offenburg University, the services offered by the Graduate School were rated as "excellent" or "very good" throughout.

Supplementary Graduate School Survey



87.5% of all first-semester students of one of the University's four international Master's programs – CME, ECM, IBC and MPE – participated in the survey, which is conducted every year.

Students were asked about their satisfaction with services provided both in preparation for and during their studies, including the quality of information received before and upon arrival, advice and support provided by Graduate School staff members, and extracurricular offerings such as the cultural program and the Senior Service (see graph above).

Especially encouraging is the fact that the ratings improved in every measure over last year's results, which were already impressive.

### MAKE IT IN GERMANY

"Make it in Germany" is a new welcome portal of the German government that warmly welcomes international qualified professionals and their families in Germany: They can use the welcome portal to find out how they can come to live and work in Germany – and why it is worthwhile doing so.

German companies are increasingly looking to recruit well-qualified professionals – particularly in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). And there is also a need for qualified professionals in the health sector – even below graduate level.

"Make it in Germany" helps all those interested in living and working in Germany make their new start. The welcome portal brings together advisory and support services. It includes information about the sectors in which qualified professionals are being sought and the necessary requirements they must meet in order to enter into employment in Germany ("Quick check"). Additionally, the interactive world map "Germany local" contains contact and services information for German institutions worldwide.

#### PORTRAIT OF ARTURO HERNANDEZ, IBC ALUMNUS

"I would like to share a part of my life with you: my experience in Germany.

In 2002, I met a German girl in Mexico and after several years being together, traveling all the time between Mexico, France and Germany, we married 2007 in Mexico and at the same time I decided to study in Europe. France was my first choice, but my German wife convinced me to choose Germany. I thought: "Why not? Germany is one of the most important countries in the world and one of the principal players in the European economic development!"

To be honest, my decision to choose the MBAprogram International Business Consulting of the Offenburg University of Applied Sciences was based on price and program. I did not have a scholarship and therefore I wanted to be sure that the time and money invested would bring some "return" for my professional career as well as for me as a person.

The IBC-program fulfilled my expectation and I can 100% recommend it. I met nice classmates and a wonderful staff. The MBA was my green card for German companies. Offenburg University is not one of the biggest, but in Germany you don't need to be in one of the "Top 5 Universities" to be recognized. Don't forget the stamp "Made in Germany".

I have now been living in Germany since August 2007 and so far it has been a wonderful experience. I already created roots in three different areas of Germany: Offenburg is the place where I studied and where my first son was born, in Frankfurt my second son was born and I got the opportunity to work for the company Bayer and now I am living close to Düsseldorf, having the chance to develop my professional carrier in the area of Supply Chain Management and at the same time enjoying the free time with my family.

It has been great to get to know the German way of managing business, which is quite different from Mexico or the US and it is very interesting to learn how Germans think and act. This experience does not only increase the value of my curriculum vitae, but it also increases my knowledge about German culture and European business. After three years in a "German work environment" and with the help of a German language teacher, I'm now speaking German well enough to join meetings and discuss in German.

If you are looking for international an experience, Germany is perhaps not the first choice for doing tourism, but it is one of the best places to work... It is not impossible to get a job in Germany as foreigner. You just need to prepare yourself, work hard and be open for it .... "
